WINDSOR LEADERSHIP


Put together in partnership with Windsor Leadership, the programme brings together leaders at CEO and COO level (or similar) from across the infrastructure sector and across business functions. The outcomes aim to push forward on the challenges facing the industry and help equip leaders with the confidence and ideas to overcome the uncertain but opportunity-laden future. The varied backgrounds of attendees from legal and financial to technical gives the programme a richness of experience that is unmatched in the infrastructure and built environment sector. The required seniority of delegates ensures that discussions are strategic and insightful, leading to a heightened understanding of the challenges and solutions for how others have steered their organisations to success.

The first of an ongoing series, this programme offers a unique environment to develop your leadership skills to engage effectively with national and global influencers – bringing benefits for you personally, your organisation and the infrastructure sector as a whole. It presents senior leaders from influential organisations a rare opportunity to refine their strategic vision and skill set amongst a cohort of other innovative thinkers and well-known industry figures.

OVERVIEW OF THE PROGRAMME

Dr Vanessa Lawrence CB HonFREng FCInstCES will be chairing the whole programme. Currently working globally as a Senior Strategic Advisor to Governments, Inter-Governmental organisations, large private sector organisations and as a Non-Executive director, she is also the Honorary Colonel of 135 Geographic Squadron Royal Engineers and was co-chair of the United Nations Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management for four years and Director General and CEO of Ordnance Survey for over 14 years.

Discussion

Following the speaker sessions, there will be opportunities to discuss the wider outcomes in a plenary set-up, as well as explore insights and learnings at a more personal level within smaller syndicate groups. Questions for discussion will include:

- What are the opportunities and challenges that you are facing as a strategic leader when balancing the needs and restraints of society?
- What do I need to do to become a more effective leader?
- What would my role look like as a strategic influencer at a national level?

DATE & VENUE

The residential programme takes place over three days and two nights at St George's House, Windsor Castle on Wednesday 8th to Friday 10th November 2017.

All meals and accommodation during the programme will be provided. To ensure real value and the chance for attendees to test and measure, the programme lasts over 6 months, comprising the 3 day residential, then a 6 week action plan and reflection piece, then at the 6 month point a team catch up on how the gained knowledge and skill set has impacted on their organisations.

THE LEARNING EXPERIENCE

The programme of about 18 participants will include a mix of inspirational speakers, in-depth discussions amongst participants in small syndicates, plenary discussions and time for reflection.

Through a series of focused syndicate sessions and first hand examples of leadership from the speakers, you will collectively explore the current and future challenges you face and will face as a leader in delivering the NNA and NIDS in this changing industry.

Sir Peter Bazalgette, chairman of ITV, great-great-grandson of Sir Joseph Bazalgette and former ICE President has agreed to speak on the programme. Sir Peter is himself an alumnus of Windsor Leadership.

The programme will operate under the Chatham House Rule. However, individual syndicate groups often agree to full confidentiality, which creates a safe space, encouraging open and honest dialogue with your peers.

Senior leaders wishing to develop their own leadership impact and effectiveness, discuss the opportunities and challenges brought on by society, and ensure that they become a voice and key influencer at a national level.
